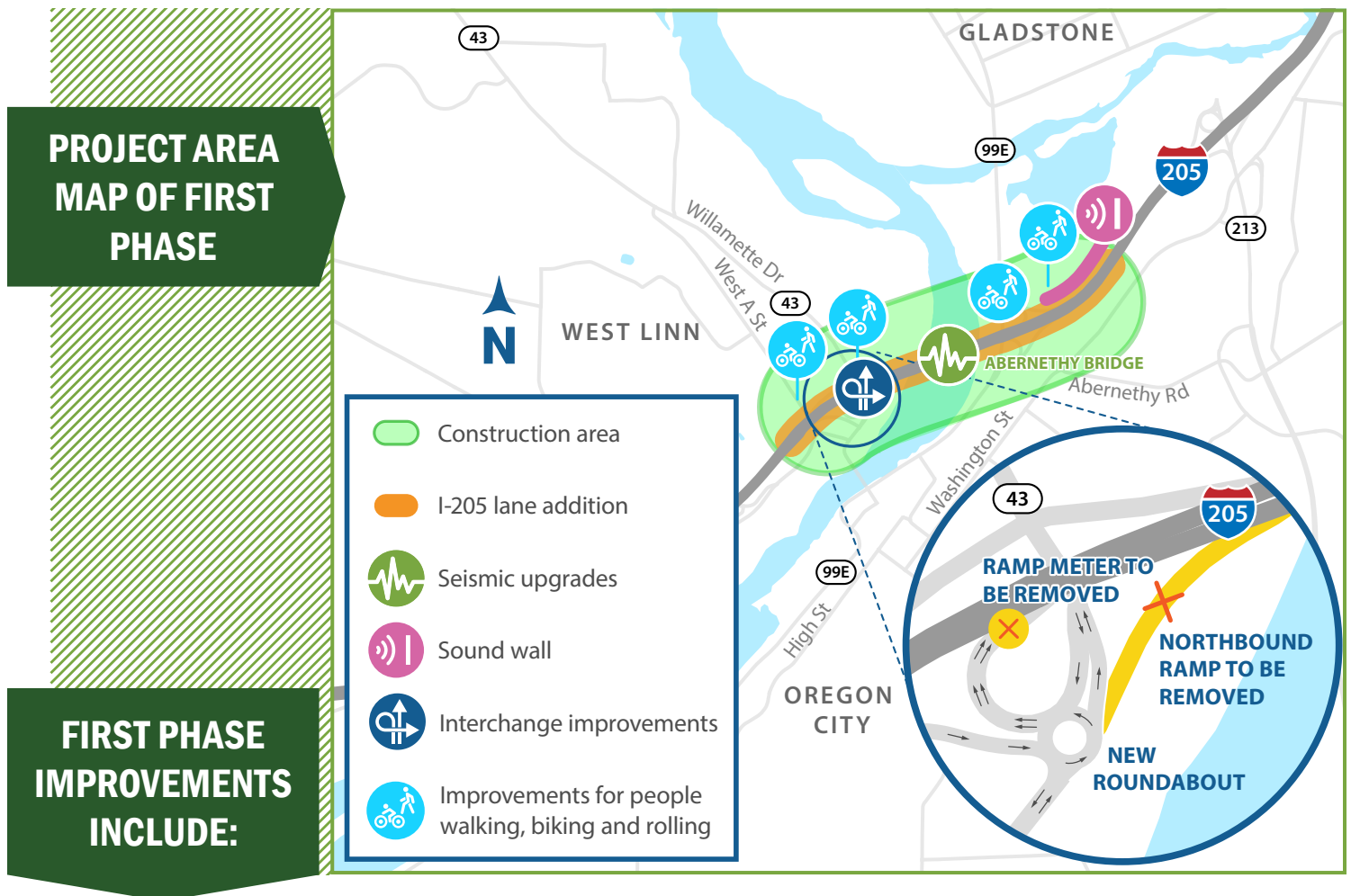

CONSTRUCTION UNDERWAY

The I-205 Improvements Project will improve our economy by providing Oregonians safer, more reliable access to work and critical services, even after an earthquake or other major disaster. Construction has started on the project's first phase and will last through 2025. Learn more about project phasing at: i205corridor.org.



- Earthquake-ready improvements to the Abernethy Bridge.
- Removing the current I-205 northbound on-ramp from OR 43 and replacing it with a roundabout.
- Realigning or widening the on-and off-ramps at OR 99E.
- Improvements for people who walk and bike on OR 43, Clackamette Drive and OR 99E.
- Installing a sound wall near the southbound lanes of I-205 at exit 9.
- Widening I-205 in the first phase of the project area will allow a third travel lane in each direction. The final lane configuration will be completed in a future phase.

FIRST PHASE CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

Visit i205corridor.org to sign up for email updates and learn about any traffic impacts or route detours. Anticipated impacts include:

- Jon Storm Park parking lot under the Abernethy Bridge is closed for the duration of construction.
- Full nighttime freeway closures later in the construction process, anticipated in 2024.
- Full weekend, nighttime directional closures and on-and off-ramp width restrictions.
- Detours for I-205 northbound and southbound travelers and those traveling to local destinations in and around Oregon City and West Linn during freeway closures.

NOISE AND OTHER IMPACTS

People who live and work in the project area will experience noise from construction equipment and vehicles, pile driving for bridge access, bridge demolition and other construction-related noise sources.

- Night work for pile driving activities will require some lights which can be directed to minimize impacts on area residents.
- Stationary lights with low lumens will be placed in the river to alert boaters.
